Areas of Compliance and Reporting:

1. Mandatory Reporting

Laws vary from state to state. Behaviors that may be covered by mandatory reporting laws may include:

- Child abuse and neglect
- Elder abuse and neglect
- Abuse and neglect of mentally or physically disabled individuals
- Suicide threats
- Other threats to the well-being of others
